

Idiom Cube

Objective: Students will explain common idioms.

Materials: • Glue

To Make:

(Everything can be printed on card stock paper and laminated to add to durability or printed on regular paper for quick use.)

1. Print entire "Idiom Cube" activity.
2. Assemble idiom cubes by cutting along the dotted lines, folding on the solid lines, and gluing the tabs inside.
3. If you have more than five students playing at a time, you may group them into teams or print more game cubes to accommodate all students. Printing more just means that some students will be using the same game cube.

To Play:

1. Give each student an idiom game cube. Have one student roll their cube. Once the cube has stopped, the student will read the idiom and then explain what it means. (If the student has difficulty, you may assist them by giving a scenario in which a person would use such an expression.)
2. Continue playing by allowing the students to take turns rolling their idiom game cubes and giving explanations.
3. The activity is over once all the students have had the opportunity to explain all six idioms on their cube.
